

Rationale





November 29 – December 3, 2021 System Accreditation Engagement Review

One of the functions of a school board is to maintain and operate with current and relevant policies. Policies define the roles and responsibilities of the board in carrying out the governing of the district.

A review of the board policy manual for Broward County Public Schools reveals 20 or more policies that have not been amended, reviewed, or revised in over five years. Some policies have adoption dates of 1974 and no revisions or amendments since. Conversations with school leaders indicate that the board is beginning to engage in <u>a plan of board</u> <u>policy updates to bring the manual up to date.</u> It was recommended by Cognia that we move aggressively on these revisions.

Revision the way our policies are categorized and accessed online. Make the searching of our policy more user-friendly.


TRAINING




PROJECT WORKLOAD

Concern from Board: duration of the project

Initial reviews of all policies will be completed no later than june 2025



The COGNIA team visited the District from November 29 – December 3, 2021 and conducted more than 230 interview sessions with School Board members, the Interim Superintendent, District administrators, teachers, staff, labor representatives, parents, students and community stakeholders. The team also virtually visited 48 schools to observe District and school practices and – over several months –analyzed comprehensive performance data and supporting documentation. At the conclusion of the visit, the COGNIA team announced BCPS was awarded reaccreditation for five more years.



Clarification on final policy : What will all policies include as of 2025/26

- Input from our community, committee, and other stakeholders
- Legally compliant with the laws and rule requirements
- Reduction in number of duplicate and contradictory policies
- Policies will serve the current needs of the district and our students
- New policy number and template refresh, retitled to better speak to the policy's subject matter
- Sustainability in the review process (see below): Policy 1000 (Formerly Policy No. 1001)

7. (POLICY) RULE UPDATES

All Each rule (policy) must be reviewed and/or revised within five (5) years of the policy's last review as often as necessary to ensure that it are correct continues to be relevant regarding the needs of the District and comply with current statutory requirements of The School Board's governing laws and rules. Additionally, the Superintendent's designee(s) shall conduct a formal review of all District rules in compliance with Section 120.74, Florida Statutes.
